### Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccination to protect against various cancers

We are offering all young people in school years 9 to 11 the Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccination in school, during the academic year from September 2022 to August 2023. The programme is first offered when young people are in school year 8.

The vaccination offers protection against up to nine HPV strains, which can cause various cancers in both males and females. It is a two dose course given as an injection in the upper arm, six to 24 months apart. <b>Will you vaccinate without a consent form?</b>	No.

<b>When is the session?</b>	Your school will tell you the date we will visit.
<b>When should I submit my response by?</b>	As soon as possible. The form will close <b>one</b> working day before the session. We will reopen it later so you can consent for future sessions.
<b>It says the email addresses don't match or it doesn't recognise the school code.</b>	Make sure there are no spaces or punctuation before or after the email address and the school code.
<b>Unable to complete the form online?</b>	Ring us on 0300 300 0007 for support.
<b>Changed your decision?</b>	Contact us using the details below to update your decision.
<b>What if my child is absent or unwell on the session day?</b>	An additional opportunity will be made available for the vaccination.
