## Keeping our school community as safe as possible

Thank you for continuing to do all you can to protect each other. The next batch of student home test kits were distributed this week to all those students who have parental consent for test kits. We are very pleased to see how much maturity and resilience our students continue to show throughout home testing, with self-testing kits.

Please can we remind you as parents/guardians that home testing twice weekly remains important in reducing the risk of transmission of infection between staff and students. That is why, whilst some measures are relaxed, if necessary, in response to the latest data, we all need to be prepared to step measures up or down in future depending on local circumstances. Remember, kits are widely available from local pharmacies or can be ordered online too.

## **Taking precautions**

There are many precautionary measures your child can do to avoid catching or spreading coronavirus:

- wash your hands with soap and water often, and utilise the hand sanitiser stations in and around school
- when you leave your home, always wash your hands when you return
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards

The treasure hunt winners are: Katie (7TC) and Isabelle (7DL). Prizes can be collected on Monday from languages. Well done!




