

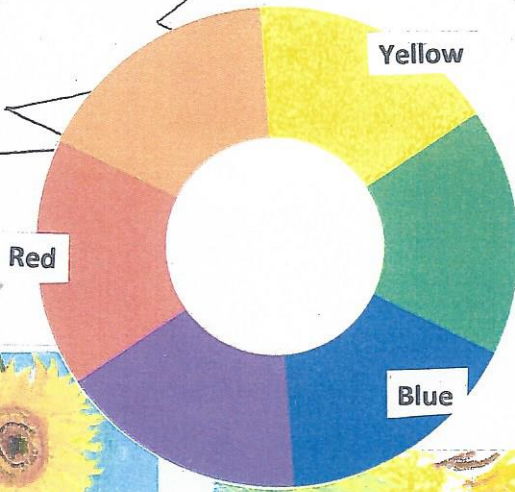
# Colour Wheel – Three Artists

Yellow

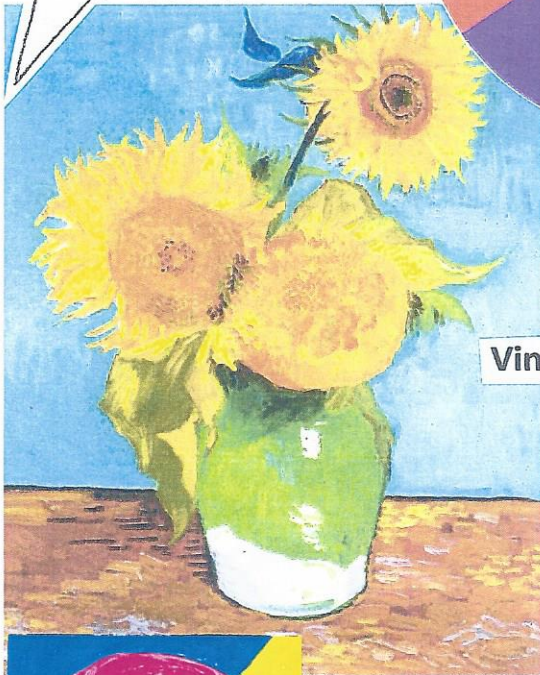
Primary colours.

Which colours are cool and which are warm ?

These 3 colours cannot be made by mixing any other colours together.



Key Facts	
Primary Colours	one of the three colours, red, yellow, and blue, that can be mixed together in different ways to create other colours
Secondary Colours	Are created by mixing two primary colours together. e.G Blue + Yellow=Green Red+Yellow=Orange Red+ Blue=Purple
Colour Spectrum	the distribution of colours produced when light is dispersed by a prism
Tints and Shades	a tint is a mixture of a colour with white, which reduces darkness, while a shade is a mixture with black, which increases darkness
Brushstroke	Is the mark made with a brush when applying paint
Colour Hue	Refers to a dominant colour e.g. a hue of purple or green. Black and white are never referred to as hues.

Pointillism is a technique of painting in which small, distinct dots of colour are applied in patterns to form an image.

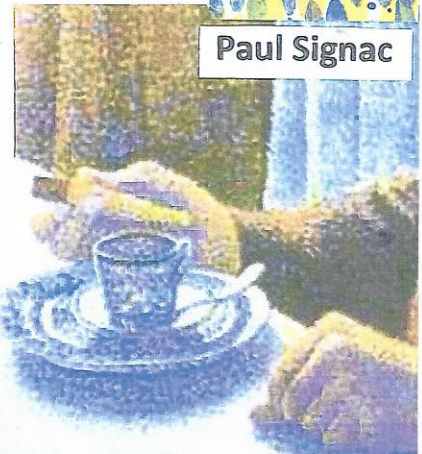
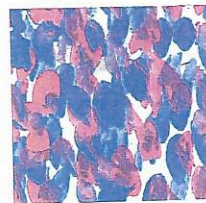
