Using both lessons and tutor times, the Personal Development curriculum aims to enable our students to understand the world around them and the world that they will be part of after their time at John Ferneley College.


Our curriculum is responsive and reactive to the needs of our students and has been formed following regular student feedback, parent consultation and influence of our pastoral team. Healthy relationships, mental health, living in the wider world and safety run as themes through each year and provide the bedrock to discussions and class explorations.





Responding to the needs of the students, Year 9 are currently focusing on the 'Options Process' during their Personal Development lessons, meaning students receive in lesson guidance giving further information about the different options available to them.

And during Year 11 Personal Development lessons, students are currently focusing on how they can prepare for adult life. Students are looking at topics such as working, studying and living independently.



#### HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY

27th January marks the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau. Holocaust Memorial Day is a day to remember the millions of people murdered in the Holocaust, under Nazi Persecution, and in the genocides which followed in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia, and Darfur.

On Wednesday, to mark
Holocaust Memorial Day, Year 9
students watched a live webcast
which was hosted by The
Holocaust Educational Trust.

Holocaust survivor who spoke
about their experience, which
was an opportunity for students
to hear first-hand from someone
who has witnessed what they
are currently studying.



Year 10 GCSE Dance students have complemented this week's curriculum theme of the 'Holocaust' by studying the professional dance anthology, 'Shadows' by Christopher Bruce.

Each trio have worked together to portray different characters from the piece – the daughter, the son and the mother. The choreographic intention of the piece is to show a family unit living in fear of shadows passing by the window to enter the door down stage right – this is the idea of soldiers coming to take the family to a concentration camp. Each character reacts showing their emotional responses to the impending doom. The daughter is frantic and panicked, the son is angry and trying to barricade the door, whereas the mother is softer; she is sad but accepting.

Our Year 10 students show these characters beautifully and I am so proud of their work. Well done all - Miss Meek.




