- need more time to process questions, requests and instructions
- may struggle meeting new people
- may struggle to pick up on unwritten rules
- may find office environments overwhelming
- may struggle with small talk and workplace relationships

Autistic strengths:

- intense focus
- attention to detail
- considered and reflective approach
- honesty and integrity
- creative thinking


How to help autistic colleagues:

He said, 'During the tour we were lucky to be able to visit the elephant orphanage in Kandy and the turtle hatchery. Most importantly we played lots of cricket including five games and two training days. The standard of the Sri Lankan cricketers was very high and they had the advantage of pitch awareness and they are accustomed to the heat. We only won the last game of the trip but did so by 10 wickets. The rest of the games were fairly close but we still didn't quite get across the line.



I was the captain of the team during the whole tour. I learnt a huge amount and my cricket has improved because of it. Ultimately I had the time of my life.'


