This week it is National Hate Crime Awareness Week. The main objective of #NationalHCAW is to encourage the authorities, key partners, and communities affected by hate crime to work together to tackle local hate crime issues.

Leicestershire Police are working with partners to raise awareness of hate crime by encouraging communities to "Say No To Hate" and report hate incidents online via the new and improved 'Stamp It Out' website.

Hate crime is when someone commits a crime against you because of your perceived or actual disability, gender identity, race, sexual orientation, religion or any other perceived difference. It is not OK – if you see it or experience it report it to us.

Isla Dixon, is the new Hate Crime Officer for Leicestershire Police. She said: "The theme for this year's National Hate Crime Awareness Week within Leicestershire is 'Messages of Hope' and there is no stronger message to offenders than our diverse communities in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland standing together side by side against hate.
