This half term your child will sit a variety of topic tests in Maths. There are many fantastic websites that are free to use, and we have also signed students up to a number of subscription websites and tools which we pay for as a school.

Knowing where and how to revise can be a challenging aspect of education. We hope that by assisting pupils with this, revision can become less stressful and develop into a practice that they are comfortable with.
