Dear Young Person and Parent / Carer,

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccination to protect against various cancers

We are offering all young people in school years 8 to 11 the Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccination in school, if they missed this when it was first offered at the start of year 8. This will be offered during this academic year between now and end of August 2023.

The vaccination offers protection against up to nine HPV strains, which can cause various cancers in both males and females. It is a two-dose course given as an injection in the upper arm, six to 24 months apart. If you already consented and we have given both doses:

If you already consented and only one or no dose has been given:

You do not need to fill out another consent form.

We will offer the next dose when we visit the school next.

If you already consented and have changed your mind:

You need to let us know. Get in touch as soon as possible.

If you have not consented and would like to consent:

- **You only need to submit your decision once for the full-course of vaccinations.**

SOME FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Will you vaccinate without a consent form?	No.
Where can I read the vaccine product leaflet?	Visit: https://www.medicines.org.uk/emc/files/pil.7330.pdf
When is the session?	Your school will tell you the date we will visit.
When should I submit my response by?	As soon as possible. The form will close one working day before the session. We will reopen it later so you can consent for future sessions.
It says the email addresses don't match or it doesn't recognise the school code.	Make sure there are no spaces or punctuation before or after the email address and the school code.
Unable to complete the form online?	Ring us on 0300 300 0007 for support.
Changed your decision?	Contact us using the details below to update your decision.
What if my child is absent or unwell on the session day?	<p>An additional opportunity will be made available for the vaccination.</p> <p>If we cannot see your child in school due to exams or exam leave, we will invite you to make an appointment at one of our summer community clinics. If your child is currently in year 11, you must make this appointment before the end of August of this year. After this time, your child is no longer eligible to be seen by our service due to their age.</p>
How do I know if my child has already had the vaccine(s)?	<p>You can either contact your GP to ask them or you can email us on: communityimmunisations.service@nhs.net and we can check for you.</p> <p>Please bear in mind that response times using our email service may be up to 5 working days during our busier periods.</p>
