3-in-1 teenage booster and meningitis vaccinations programme for young people

We are offering all young people in school years 9 to 11 the 3-in-1 teenage booster and the meningitis vaccinations in school, if they missed this when it was first offered in year 9. This will be offered during this academic year between now and end of August 2023.

These routine vaccinations ensure continued protection against tetanus, diphtheria, polio (Td/IPV) and provide protection against meningitis types ACW and Y.

SOME FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Will you vaccinate without a consent form?	No.
Where can I read the vaccine product leaflet?	For the 3-in-1 teenage booster, visit: https://www.medicines.org.uk/emc/product/5581/pil For the Meningitis ACWY, visit: https://www.medicines.org.uk/emc/product/4118/pil
When is the session?	Your school will tell you the date we will visit.
When should I submit my response by?	As soon as possible. The form will close one working day before the session. We will reopen it later so you can consent for future sessions.
It says the email addresses don't match or it doesn't recognise the school code.	Make sure there are no spaces or punctuation before or after the email address and the school code.
Unable to complete the form online?	Ring us on 0300 300 0007 for support.
Changed your decision?	Contact us using the details below to update your decision.
What if my child is absent or unwell on the session day?	An additional opportunity will be made available for the vaccination. If we cannot see your child in school due to exams or exam leave, we will invite you to make an appointment at one of our summer community clinics. If your child is currently in year 11, you must make this appointment before the end of August of this year. After this time, your child is no longer eligible to be seen by our service due to their age.
How do I know if my child has already had the vaccine(s)?	You can either contact your GP to ask them or you can email us on: communityimmunisations.service@nhs.net and we can check for you. Please provide your child's name, date of birth and school attended. Please bear in mind that response times using our email service may be up to 5 working days during our busier periods.
