All students with falling or lower attendance will be offered support to address this and parents are urged to contact the school with any concerns or advice sought. Attendance below 90% requires medical evidence to back up absence. HOLIDAYS are NOT authorised and will be referred to county hall for possible fining.

Group 1 100-96%	No Concern Students with this attendance should achieve the best grades they can leading to better prospects in the future.
Group 2 95.9% - 90%	Note Students with this attendance are likely to achieve their target grades but lowering attendance may mean more work to catch up on and possible missed opportunities.
Group 3 89.9%and below	Risk of under achievement Students with this attendance find it difficult to achieve their target grades, underachieve in subjects and miss out on other opportunities such as clubs and extra-curricular activities.
