Personal Development Update

As we move into our second term I thought it would be a good idea to send you an update on what we are studying in Personal Development lessons.

Year 7

Year 7 have had a wonderful time getting to know their teachers and settling into school. A lot of the activities we have done in lessons so far have centred on friendships. A large part of our PD curriculum looks at the attributes of positive and healthy relationships and this is the Y7 introduction to this. This term we will be looking at online safety where we look at students becoming "Internet Citizens".

Year 8

Year 8 started the year continuing on from their work last year on healthy relationships by looking at their relationship with themselves. We have explored stereotypes, making judgements and how to handle pressures from different areas of their lives. This term students will begin to look at intimate relationships.

Year 9

Year 9 have again built on their prior knowledge on healthy relationships and have started to look at romantic and physical relationships. Lessons have focused on identifying positive and negative traits in relationships and how to tackle unhealthy behaviours. This term we will look further into consent but also build on Y7 and Y8 work to look at online dangers too. Students will sensitively and appropriately explore some of these difficult issues with their teachers. If you are concerned about any of the information above then please do get in contact.







Year 10

Last term Year 10 continued to look at the healthy relationship work they have built on in KS3 and explored further topics surrounding consent. We looked at the relationship cycle and how relationships may move into different phases as time goes on. We have looked at different types of intimacy and how the media portrays unrealistic expectations on body types, wealth and happiness. This term we will move on to Mental Health and Wellbeing. We will continue on from the work started explore specific MH challenges. There will be a focus on eating disorders this term (please contact Mr Kieres (via website contact form) if this will be difficult for your child – we aim to have fully inclusive safe classrooms but appreciate this topic will be difficult for some students. We are going to show the Freddie Flintoff: Living with Bulimia documentary in lessons – it is rated as "G" for guidance by the BBC and contains some upsetting scenes (more information https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/m000n1xx) if you would NOT like your child to watch this please let the PD team know via website contact form by Monday 5th February.

Year 11

Year 11 have been, once again, looking at positive relationships and external dangers. As the oldest year group they have explored difficult topics relating to abuse, honour-based violence and unhealthy relationships. They have been exceptionally mature about discussing and dealing with these topics in lessons. We are going to be spend the first few weeks in January looking at managing stress and pressures of exam and checking on college applications. Towards the end of this half term we will complete their topic on dangers and relationships we would like to show them the documentary Abused by my Girlfriend this is rated as a "G" for guidance on the BBC and contains some upsetting scenes and strong language (more information https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/p0700912/abused-by-my-girlfriend) if you would NOT like your child to watch this please let the PD team know via website contact form by Monday 5th February.

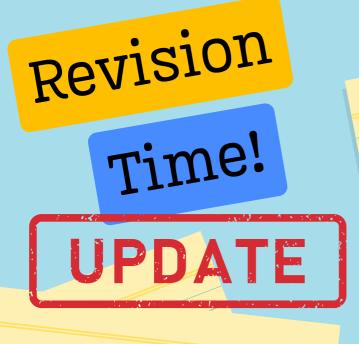



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
