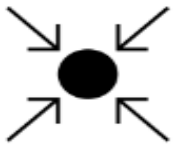

Field of the Cloth of Gold

One reason

One of Wolsey's greatest successes in foreign policy was the Field of Cloth of Gold in 1520. This was when Wolsey tried to uphold Henry's reputation of the peacemaker of Europe. In order to do this, he organised two great conferences between Henry and Charles V. Henry and Francis I also had a conference at Calais to show the equality between both kings, neither Henry or Francis camped higher than the other and to show their trust, both kings dined with each other's wives. These acts allowed for a success as not only did it enhance Henry's reputation of peacemaker, but also as an important figure in Europe, it made Henry appear at the same level as Francis and Charles as the 3 great rulers of Europe.

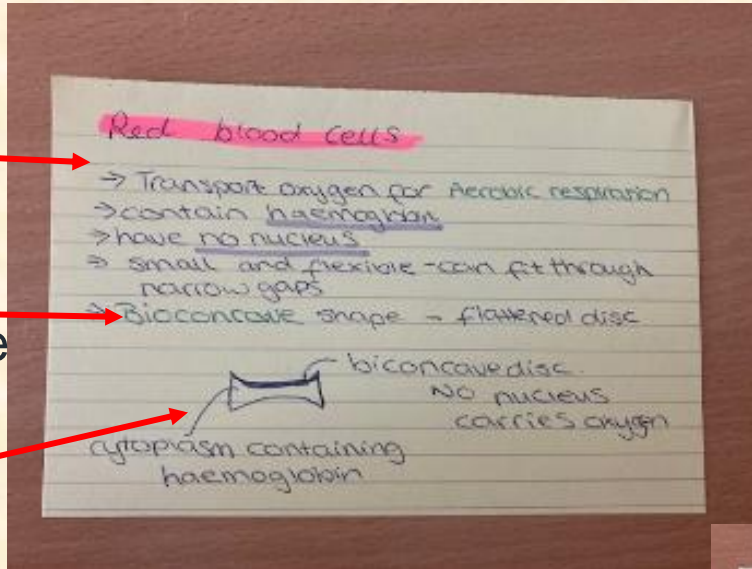

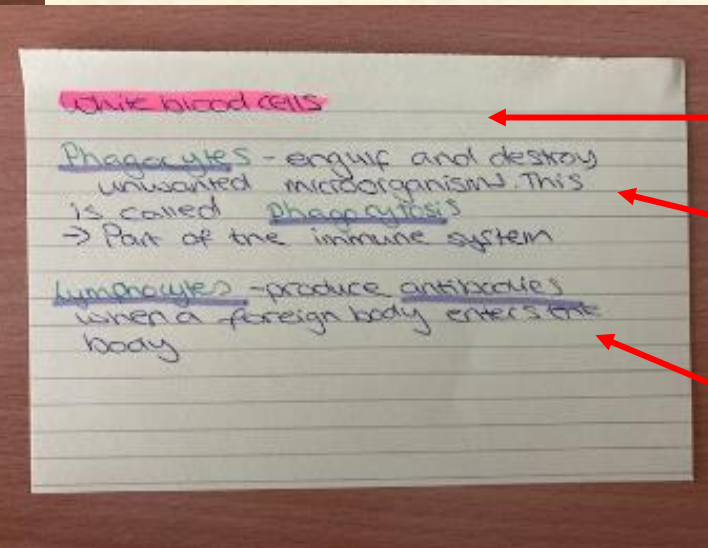
